Visa procedures for work permit holders (Volunteers or NGO workers)

If you are currently outside of Canada, you must apply for a Visa in the country you are currently located

1. If the applicant does not have a valid visa or re-entry permit, the applicant must request a new visa (Single Entry Only), by filling in the information and upload all required documents online at https://www.thaievisa.go.th/ (Please note that the visa application fee is non-refundable)

## 2. Required documents to upload in the system

- 2.1 Copy of Passport
- 2.2 One passport-size photographs (2"x 2")
- 2.3 Declaration form with a signature of the applicant (Signature must be signed with an ink pen).
- 2.4 Proof of flight confirmation/reservation, indicating the trip from Canada to Thailand.
- 2.5 Copy of recent bank statement. The name of the applicant must be indicated clearly), In case of submitting a family bank statement, proof of relationship (i.e. birth certificate, marriage certificate) must be provided.
- 2.6 Invitation letter or an official letter from the NGO, Charity, or organization that the applicant will be working with a copy of the business license
- **3**. The applicant may **register for Thailand Pass at** <a href="https://tp.consular.go.th">https://tp.consular.go.th</a> while waiting for a Visa to be processed
- **4.** At the departure airport, the approved applicant is required to present
- 4.1 Thailand Pass
- 4.2 Medical insurance or letter from employer guaranteeing that the insurance company or employer will cover a minimum of 50,000 US dollars (or equivalent in other currencies) of medical costs incurred by the applicant in Thailand, including medical costs in the event that applicant contracts COVID-19 (The insurance must cover the whole duration of stay in Thailand); and
- 4.3 A laboratory result indicating that COVID -19 is not detected, issued no more than 72 hours before departure

## **5.** Upon entry to Thailand,

Travelers arriving in Thailand during the COVID-19 pandemic must present the following documents to be granted entry:

- 5.1 Thailand Pass
- 5.2 Medical certificate with a laboratory result indicating that COVID -19 is not detected, using RT-PCR test, issued no more than 72 hours before departure
- 5.3 Medical insurance guaranteeing that the insurance company or employer will cover a minimum of 50,000 US dollars (or equivalent in other currencies) of medical costs incurred by the applicant in Thailand, including medical costs in the event that applicant contracts COVID-19 (The insurance must cover the whole duration of stay in Thailand)
