

For diplomats and officials of international organisations and their family members

While Thailand still puts in place travel restriction, diplomats or officials of international organisations who are returning to Thailand, or are going to Thailand for their overseas postings or temporary official missions, can apply for the Certificate of Entry at the Royal Thai Consulate General.

Required documents, which must be registered online to coethailand.mfa.go.th/

1. An official note issued by the Global Affairs Canada / international organisation requesting the Certificate of Entry, providing the following information :

- a. Your name, DOB, position and scope of work in Thailand, and intended date of arrival, as well as your family members who will accompany you (if any), with copy of passports
- b. Certifying that you and your family members are consent to 14-day self-quarantine under the supervision of the embassy/international organisation

2. A letter from the respective embassy/international organisation in Thailand affirming responsibility for healthcare or treatment expenses, or documentary evidence demonstrating a guarantee that the traveller is able to take responsibility for his/her own healthcare or treatment expenses, including for COVID-19, throughout the duration of stay in Thailand, or copy of your insurance policy which covers COVID and no less than 100,000 USD, covering the whole intended period of stay.

3. **Declaration form**, duly completed and signed

Unless you have a valid visa, you have to apply for both the Certificate of Entry and visa, providing all supporting documents.

What you need to present at airlines check-in counter and upon arrival in Thailand:

1. The Certificate of Entry
2. Fit to Fly health certificate, issued within 72 hours before departure this is a statement by a doctor that you are free from symptoms and fit to fly (must be separate from COVID test)
3. Medical certificate with a **laboratory result** using RT-PCR test indicating that COVID -19 is not detected. Such COVID-19 test **result** must be **issued no more than 72 hours before departure**
4. Letter from the embassy/international organisation affirming responsibility for healthcare or treatment expenses, or documentary evidence demonstrating a guarantee that the traveller is able to take responsibility for his/her own healthcare or treatment expenses, including for COVID-19, throughout the duration of stay in Thailand, or copy of your insurance policy which covers COVID and no less than 100,000 USD
5. **T.8 form**
