Non-Immigrant O Visa (90-days Family Visa)

If you are currently outside of Canada, you must apply for a Visa in the country you are currently located

To visit as the relative of a Thai national, the applicant must show documents proving such a relationship.

Step 1 – Online e-Visa Application:

Complete the online e-Visa Application at https://thaievisa.go.th/ and upload the following documents in PDF or JPG formats:

- 1. Photo taken with a light color background with a full- face view of the person without wearing a hat or dark glasses and covering up shoulders
- 2. Photo taken while holding passport with a light color background with a full-face view of the person without wearing a hat or dark glasses and covering up shoulders
- 3. A copy of Passport (must not expire within 6 months)
- 4. Proof financial showing monthly income minimum 40,000 Baht (for last two month) or Bank balance 400,000 Baht
- 5. The applicant must present a valid and effective marriage certificate and a copy of the spouse's Thai Passport or Thai National I.D. card. Fiancés are not included in this category.

For non-Canadian citizens:

- -A copy of the permanent resident card or a copy of valid Canadian Work/Study Visa/Permit
- For self-employed, business license or business registration indicating the applicant's name.

To Remind: Your visa request may be denied when:

- (1) upload unprepared documents and photo;
- (2) information uploaded does not meet requirement; and
- (3) applying for wrong visa.
- You must complete the online application with your full name, as it appears on the passport. If completed incorrectly, you will have to re-apply for the new one and resubmit the payment. Please note that the form cannot be modified after the payment is made.

Step 2 – Submit Application:

Upon completion of an online visa application from the applicant, the Royal Thai Consulate-General will review the application. If the application is approved, the visa will be issued electronically to the applicant's email provided in the application. Applicants no longer have to submit the original passport to the Consulate-General.
